
## Kariba

Visit the monuments of Kariba, see pictures and be informed on how an operation called Noah was conducted when the water of Kariba dam started to rise. 4700 species of animals were rescued including elephants in what became the largest and most famous animal rescue since the Ark. At Kariba Dam you will witness some fishermen




fighting with the tiger fish. A sunset cruise in the dam will enable you to see lots of animals on the shores of Kariba. All hotels are of International standard.

Lake Kariba is one of the largest man-made lakes in the world and it is 290km long and 32km wide. At Kariba there is history of Nyami Nyami, the river god of the Zambezi river who has the head of a fish and the tail of a snake. He claims that one-day he will bring down the Dam wall to reunite with his wife who is trapped on the other side of the Dam. The construction of the dam wall, took 4 years with a workforce of 10 000 men. In the process, 87 Italians lost their lives in an unusual way.

## Eastern Highlands

This is Zimbabwe's most mountainous area, a pleasurable pastime for the independent travelers. The three beautiful mountains ranges of Nyanga, Vumba and Chimanimani which run down Zimbabwe's border with Mozambique provide the visitor with welcome coolness, fresh air, clean running mountain streams, forests and wonderful rugged countryside. The mountain places offer magnificent mix of farflung peaks, expansive grassy slopes, forested gorges, boulder-topped hills, panoramic views, waterfalls, trout streams, ancient ruins, masses of wild flowers, natural rainforest which



clings to its steep, mist-covered slopes and valleys, and the Botanical gardens which cover some 30 hectares.
